The Kindergarten teachers will evaluate readiness skills during Kindergarten registration.

Mrs. Nastro, School Nurse, will do vision and hearing screening tests during the school year.

Speech and Language screenings will be done in early fall by the school Speech Therapist.

Students must be 5 years old by October 1, 2020.

Medical Requirements For Registration:

Physical Exam: Must be completed within the past 1 year of Kindergarten start date

Immunization: Proof in writing of the following:
DPT/DTAP 4 doses with 1 given on or after the 4th birthday
or any 5 doses

Polio Primary Series 3 doses with 1 dose given on or after the 4th
birthday or any 4 doses

MMR - 2 doses

Hepatitis B – Three Doses

Varicella (Chicken Pox) – 1 dose on or after 1st birthday

Tuberculosis (skin test) -Mantoux –PPD

(not necessary if born in US)

Health History: the nurse will take a complete Health History.

**Please be sure all immunizations and the physical form are completed prior to your
Child's Kindergarten registration.**

WOODROW WILSON SCHOOL HEALTH SCREENING PROGRAM

The State of New Jersey mandates health-screening programs for the public school students.

Screenings are done as follows:

- **Height, Weight, and Blood Pressure**-all students
- **Vision Screening**-grades K, 2, 4, 6, 8
- **Hearing Screening**-Grades ~~K, 1, 2, 3, 7~~
- **Scoliosis Screening**-Grades ~~5, 7~~

The Neptune City School District offers a comprehensive Health Screening Program to help identify potential health problems. Parents will be given the opportunity to participate in this free program, or may choose to see their family physician, at their own expense, for the necessary screenings. If you have any questions regarding the examination procedures, please contact the school nurse.

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Dear Parents/Guardian,

As we start a new school year, I would like to share some information about medications that need to be given during the school day.

- 1) All medications require a doctor's order that must be renewed yearly. We cannot use last year's orders. I have forms for asthma, epipens and a standard form for all other medications. If you need a blank form, please contact me and I can send it home with your child. This applies even if your child will be receiving a medication temporarily (i.e. An antibiotic.)
- 2) All medications must be in the original bottle or package with the pharmacy label attached. If there are multiple medications or pieces of equipment, please place them in a Ziploc bag with your child's name clearly written on the outside.
- 3) In order to ensure the safety of your child and all children at Woodrow Wilson, the child should not transport medications to school. All medications should be brought to the nurse's office by a parent, guardian or other adult.
- 4) COUGH DROPS ARE A MEDICATION and require a note. They must remain in the nurse's office.
