C-1. Resolutions to Adopt the 2023-2024 School Budget and Related Staff Travel

The Superintendent recommends approval to adopt the Tentative Budget for FY 2023-2024:

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education adopted a tentative budget on March 16, 2023, and submitted it to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools for approval, and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget was approved by the Executive County Superintendent of Schools on April 18, 2023 and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget was advertised in the legal section of the Asbury Park Press on April 21, 2023 and

WHEREAS, the final budget was presented to the public during a hearing held in the Board of Education Administrative Offices Neptune City, NJ, on April 26, 2023.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has now determined to make the following corrections to the adoption of the final budget resolution to meet state budget reporting requirements:

The adjustment for enrollment was reported in the adoption of the 2023-24 Tentative Budget as \$142,939. The correct adjustment for enrollment in the 2023-24 budget is \$140,136. Correction will be reflected in the adoption of the Final Budget.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Neptune City Board of Education includes in the final budget the adjustment for enrollment in the amount of \$140,136. The district intends to utilize this adjustment for supplies and materials necessary for the additional students.

Adjustment for HEALTH CARE COSTS

BE IT RESOLVED that the Neptune City Board of Education includes in the final budget the adjustment for increased costs of health benefits in the amount of \$67,181. The additional funds will be used to pay for the additional increases in health benefit premiums.

C. 2. Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement 2023-2024

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education established \$8,000 as the maximum travel amount for the current school year and has expended \$6,181.51 as of this date; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$8,000 for the 2023-2024 school year.
