Adjustment for ENROLLMENT

BE IT RESOLVED that the Neptune City Board of Education includes in the final budget the adjustment for enrollment in the amount of \$142,939. The district intends to utilize this adjustment for supplies and materials necessary for the additional students.

Adjustment for HEALTH CARE COSTS

BE IT RESOLVED that the Neptune City Board of Education includes in the final budget the adjustment for increased costs of health benefits in the amount of \$67,181. The additional funds will be used to pay for the additional increases in health benefit premiums.
