NEPTUNE CITY BOARD OF EDUCATION RESOLUTION TO ADOPT BUDGET 2016-2017 April 28, 2016

RESOLVED that the Neptune City Board of Education includes in the proposed budget the adjustment for increased costs of health benefits in the amount of \$51,688. The additional funds are included in the base budget and will be used to pay for the additional increases in health benefits.

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.2 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, a Board of Education may establish, for regular district business travel as defined in NJAC 6A:23A-1.2, which includes attendance at regularly scheduled in-State county meetings, Department or Association sponsored events or in-State professional development activities for which the registration fee does not exceed \$150.00 per employee or board member, where prior Board approval shall not be required unless the annual threshold for a staff member exceeds \$1,500 in a given school year (July 1 through June 30); and

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education established \$9,100.00 as the maximum travel amount for the current school year and has expended \$2,374.00 as of this date; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A: 23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$8,000.00 for all staff and board members for the 2016-2017 school year.

BE IT RESOLVED that the revised budget be adopted for the 2016-2017 School Year using the 2016-2017 state aid figures.

LEA ASSURANCES AND APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION SPECIAL EDUCATION-MEDICAID INITIATIVE (SEMI): REIMBURSEMENT SYSTEM MEDICAID ELIGIBLE PUPILS, AGES 3 TO 21: FISCAL YEARS 2015-2016 and 2016-2017

Assurances: The applicant hereby assures the SEA that for each pupil included in the Special Education-Medicaid Initiative:

1. There is an individualized education program (IEP) in place for each pupil who received related services.

2. The LEA has established a goal of providing a free appropriate public education (FAPE) for all pupils with disabilities.

3. All policies, procedures and programs for children with disabilities in the LEA are consistent with 34 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Parts 99 and 300 and 74-80 Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR).

4. The LEA has developed policies and implemented procedures consistent with New Jersey Administrative Code (N.J.A.C.) 6A:32, Pupil Records; and 6A:14-1.2, 1.3, and 2.3, Special Education.

There are written reports, signed and dated by certified/licensed practitioners, as appropriate, for all special education evaluation/reevaluation services provided to pupils.
 All professional services (e.g., psychological counseling, physical therapy) which are billed and required in a pupil's IEP are delivered by appropriately certified school practitioners who meet Medicaid requirements.

7. There is documentation of the services (specifically: date of service; type of service; signature of certified practitioner) provided to each special education pupil.

8. The provision of service(s) is in accordance with the pupil's IEP.

9. There is documentation for transportation that has been provided to pupils to enable them to receive services associated with special education.

10. The LEA will develop written procedures and internal controls pertaining to the maintenance and provision of required documentation to support all claims to Medicaid and; the LEAs will identify a district contact person who will have responsibility for the project. 11. The LEA billing information for Medicaid will be limited to services allowed in the Initiative and will be submitted in a timely manner, according to requirements established by the state

12. The LEA intends to be proactive in obtaining informed, written parental consent (a) for sharing personally identifiable pupil information (e.g., name, address, date-of-birth, social security number); service data (e.g.; physical therapy) classification and placement, with the departments of Education, Human Services, and Treasury and their agents (e.g.; rate development or billing agents), as necessary; and (b) for submitting billing information to the State for special education services delivered to each of the LEA's Medicaid-eligible pupils for whom consent has been received.

13. Annually, as part of the district's independent audit, the Medicaid billing information and supporting documentation are to be reviewed and the independent auditors are to be permitted access to necessary pupil records and to district financial statements relating to the Initiative.

11. Data Sharing Agreement SEMI 2015-16 and 2016-17:

The following:

Whereas, the Neptune City School District (hereinafter referred to as "School District"), located in Neptune City, New Jersey, and serves the students of The Borough of Neptune City, provides education and related health services to enrolled students, including services compensated under the New Jersey Medicaid program; and

Whereas, Public Consulting Group (PCG) is a consulting firm performing Medicaid reimbursement services for the New Jersey Department of the Treasury; and

A. Whereas, PCG, in performing said Medicaid services, also assists Neptune City School District to identify students with Medicaid, to calculate the Medicaid eligibility rate (MER), to submit Medicaid claims, and to develop more effective Medicaid outreach programs;

B. Therefore, for mutual benefit and consideration duly acknowledged by both parties to this Agreement, it is hereby agreed as follows:

C.1. Neptune City School District will provide PCG, as its agent for performing the services described above, access to student files for the sole purpose of carrying out said services.

D.2. PCG will act as agent for Neptune City School District for the sole purpose of properly performing the Medicaid-related services described above.

E. TERM: PCG will provide the said services with respect to the school quarter beginning July through September, 2016 and will continue to provide said services until the agreement is terminated by either party following thirty (30) days advance notice.

F. INDEMNIFICATION: PCG will indemnify and hold Neptune City School District harmless from all claims, losses, expenses, fees, including attorney fees, costs and judgments that may be asserted against Neptune City School District as a result of any negligence by PCG in performing services under this agreement.

G. CONFIDENTIALITY: PCG agrees to take reasonable steps to ensure the physical security of data that comes under its control and to abide by all pertinent laws and regulations relating to confidentiality of such data.

H. APPLICABLE LAW: This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

12. To approve Coastal Learning Center to continue providing meals for our students at no cost. *N.J.A.C.* 6A:23-4.5(A)20 required Private Schools for Students with Disabilities who provide student meal (ii) to apply for funding by the Child Nutrition Program administered by the New Jersey Department of Agriculture, and (iii) to charge students who receive paid and reduced meals under eligibility criteria established by the Child Nutrition Program - unless these requirements are specifically waived on an annual basis by a majority of sending school districts.

The Board hereby resolves that Coastal Learning Center has not applied for or received funding from the Child Nutrition Program as administered by the New Jersey Department of Agriculture. The Board further resolves that Coastal Learning Center shall not charge students for paid and reduced meals in accordance with the income eligibility criteria established by the Child Nutrition Program as administered by the NJ Department of Agriculture.

- 13. To approve contract between Preferred Home Health Care and Neptune City Board of Education for professional nursing services for two students for the 2016-2017 school year for the period 7/1/2016 6/30/17 at a rate of \$92/hour for RN services for two students or \$77/hour for LPN services for two students.
