BE IT RESOLVED that the tentative budget be approved for the 2022-2023 School Year using the 2022-2023 state aid figures and the Interim School Business Administrator/Board Secretary be authorized to submit the following tentative budget to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools for approval in accordance with the statutory deadline:

C.2 Related Staff Travel

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

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WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education established \$8,000 as the maximum travel amount for the current school year and has expended \$ 7,499.56 as of this date; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approve travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A: 23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$8,000 for all staff and Board Members for the 2022-203 school year.
