GARDEN STATE SCHOOLS INSURANCE FUND NON-BINDING RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO JOIN

WHEREAS, a number of local governmental units in various parts of the State of New Jersey have joined together to form a School Board Insurance Group joint self-insurance fund as permitted by N.J.S.A. 18A:18B-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, there has been discussion regarding the formation of a Garden State Schools Insurance Fund (GSSIF) for local governmental units;

WHEREAS, the statutes and regulations governing the creation and operation of a School Board Insurance Group contain elaborate restrictions and safeguards concerning the safe and efficient administration of the public interest entrusted to such a Group; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the City of Neptune has determined that membership in the GSSIF would be in the best interest of itself and its citizens;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the City of Neptune does hereby resolve that the Neptune City Board of Education intends to become a member of the GSSIF for the purpose of establishing the following types of coverage:

- 1. Workers' compensation and employers' liability;
- 2. General liability, including employment practices and school board legal liability;
- 3. Motor vehicle liability;
- 4. Crime, employee dishonesty and position bonds; and
- 5. Property damage (buildings, contents, equipment and motor vehicles);

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such membership is subject to the right to accept terms of membership when the same is received from the GSSIF, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such membership is subject to the right to accept the Bylaws and Initial Assessment of the GSSIF, as approved and adopted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:10-39, when the same is received from the GSSIF.

Neptune City Board of Education ADOPTION OF THE 2020-2021 TENTATIVE BUDGET

A.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the tentative budget be approved for the 2020-2021 School Year using the 2020-2021 state aid figures and that the Secretary to the Board of Education be authorized to submit the following tentative budget to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools for approval in accordance with the statutory deadline:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a public hearing be held at the Woodrow Wilson School, 210 West Sylvania Avenue, Neptune City, New Jersey on April 30, 2020 at 6:00 PM for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on the budget for the 2020-2021 School Year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the General Fund Tax Levy as described above results in a tax levy of \$6,819,052, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the debt service tax levy as described above results in a tax levy of \$488,411, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, to advertise said tentative budget in the Asbury Press or the Coaster on April 16, 2020.

B.

Related Staff Travel

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.2 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, a Board of Education may establish, for regular district business travel as defined in N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-1.2, which includes attendance at regularly scheduled in-State county meetings, Department or Association sponsored events or in-State professional development activities for which the registration fee does not exceed \$150.00 per employee or board member, where prior Board approval shall not be required unless the annual threshold for a staff member exceeds \$1,500 in a given school year (July 1 through June 30); and

WHEREAS, the Neptune City Board of Education established \$8,000 as the maximum travel amount for the current school year and has expended \$4,517.51 as of this date; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A: 23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$8,000 for all staff and board members for the 2020-2021 school year.
